

Crop	Variety Name	Description
Tomato	Black Krim	Indeterminate, beefsteak, purple/red. Great heirloom flavor. Slightly smoky.
Tomato	Cherokee Purple	Indeterminate, beefsteak. 12 to 16-ounce fruit come in shades of dusty rose to purple, sometimes with greenish shoulders. Sweet aftertaste, almost like candy.
Tomato	Coure Di Bue	Indeterminate, slicer. Red and meaty with few seeds. Heart shaped fruits great for preserving.
Tomato	Gardener's Delight	Indeterminate, cherry. Sweet with classic tomato flavor. Crack resistant and early producer.
Tomato	Glacier	Semi-Determinate. Midsize slicer. Red. Short plants reach 2-3 feet. Sets fruits in cooler temperatures and early maturing.
Tomato	Gold Nugget	Determinate. Cherry, yellow. Small plant reaching 20-30 inches, great for containers. Prefers to set fruit in cool weather.
Tomato	Italian Roma	Determinate, roma. Compact size.
Tomato	Juliet	Indeterminate. Grape. Aka "mini roma" because it is a meaty grape sized tomato that works well for fresh eating or preserving.
Tomato	Moscovich	Indeterminate, Midsize saladette. Red. Early producer and sets fruit in cooler weather.
Tomato	Pink Boar	Indeterminate, Midsize saladette. Red with green stripes. Deep rich heirloom flavor. Good keeper once harvested.
Tomato	Paul Robinson	Indeterminate, beefsteak. Large rusty red fruits. Known for its smoky and earthy flavor with a good acid/sweet balance
Tomato	Pruden's Purple	Indeterminate, beefsteak. Large pink meaty fruits can weight up to a pound. Great heirloom flavor.
Tomato	Red Cherry	Indeterminate, cherry. Produces loads of sweet red cherry. I've saved this heirloom for years. Not quite as sweet as Sweet 100s, but sweet with classic tomato flavor.
Tomato	San Marzano	Indeterminate, Roma. Prized for flavor and productivity.
Tomato	Sungold	Indeterminate. One of the best tasting tomatoes ever! Loads of sweet delicious drops of gold. Cherry sized. Tendency for fruits to crack after picking so does not store well but they taste so good you won't want to.
Tomato	Ten Fingers of Naples	Indeterminate, roma. More productive than San Marzano according to seed catalogs. I do not have personal experience growing yet.

Tomato	Tigerella	Indeterminate. Two inch fruit have a very tangy flavor, yields are very heavy, and early. Red with yellow and orange stripes. Known to do well in cooler temperatures.
Tomato	White Cherry	Indeterminate, cherry. Sweet, slightly tropical flavor. White to pale yellow fruits.
Crop	Variety Name	Description
Tomato - Dwarf	Awesome	Yellow colored medium slicer. Flavor is sweet but not mild, has a little zing.
Tomato- Dwarf	Blazing Beauty	Orange slicer. Medium to medium large, smooth oblate and a deep orange color in and out. The flavor sparkles with an ample tart bite and is quite intense.
Tomato- Dwarf	Boronia	Pink- Purple slicer. Flavor is well balanced, mild and sweet, and the variety is quite prolific. Meaty texture. Similar to Cherokee Purple.
Tomato- Dwarf	Chocolate Lightning	Chocolate-brown slicer. Medium-sized slightly-oblate, slicers with jagged green and gold stripes. The rich crimson flesh has intense and well-balanced flavors.
Tomato- Dwarf	Perfect Harmony	Orange slicer. Medium-large, up to twenty ounce, bright-orange colored, oblate shaped tomatoes with a distinctly tart, full flavor.
Tomato Dwarf	Rosella Crimson	Pink slicer. Medium oblate fruit. Vigorous and productive, with an excellent to outstanding flavor similar to Brandywine.
Tomato- Dwarf	Snakebite	Pink slicer. Oblate shaped fruit that are tasty, tangy and tart.
Tomato- Dwarf	Stony Brook Heart	Red beefsteak. Meaty, heart shaped fruits. Yellow streaks on the red skin. Classic tomato flavor, slightly sweet great for preserving or fresh eating.
Tomato Dwarf	Sweet Scarlet	Red slicer. Heavy yield of medium to medium large sized oblate, smooth red fruit, possessing a superb, intense, complex flavor—one of the very best flavored of all of the "Dwarf Tomato Project" varieties
Tomato Dwarf	Tasmanian Chocolate	Burgundy slicer. 4-6 oz., ribbed tomatoes are richly flavored and perfect for slicing onto sandwiches.
Tomato- Dwarf	Uluru Ochre	Orange-ochre tone beefsteak. Medium to large sized oblate uniquely colored. Delicious, smokey flavor. Named after Ayers Rock.
Tomato Dwarf	Wherokowhai	Yellow slicer. Medium to medium large oblate fruit are yellow with red swirls with an outstanding, sweet flavor. Pronounced fer dow co fi in Maori.
Pepper	Corbaci	Sweet. Heirloom pepper from Turkey. Sweet pepper. Long, twisted peppers great grilled or roasted.

Pepper	Corno de Rossi	Sweet, long bull horned shaped fruits are great for grilling or stuffing.
Pepper	Ordone	Hot. Small 1 inch peppers that turn from yellow to purple to orange to red. Beautiful plant that will be like christmas lights. Plant has small leaves.
Pepper	Shishito	Mild. Japanese variety prized for blistered peppers. 3 inch slightly wrinkled fruits will ripen to red. Thin walled.
Crop	Variety Name	Description
Pepper	Sinahuissa	Hot. Heirloom from Northern Mexico. Similar shape and heat level to serrano. Harvest green or red.
Eggplant	Black Beauty	Classic dark purple eggplant
Eggplant	Listada de Grandia	Purple & White striped skin, creamy white interior. Most delicious eggplant I've ever had.
Eggplant	Napoli	Dark Purple Italian variety that is long and wide. Thicker than Japanese style eggplants.

* All Dwarf tomato descriptions are based on the Dwarf Tomato project and are not from my personal experience. Please note that I have not grown any of the dwarf varieties other than Tasmanian Chocolate in the Phoenix area.
